Cuba Middle School would love to have a monthly parent led meeting. We want to hear feedback about what is working or not working and any suggestions you have that will help make our school year successful!

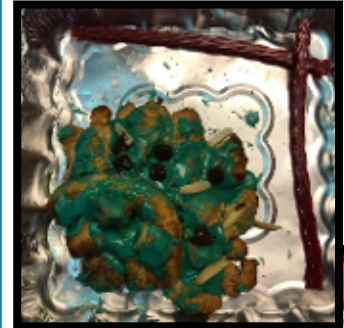

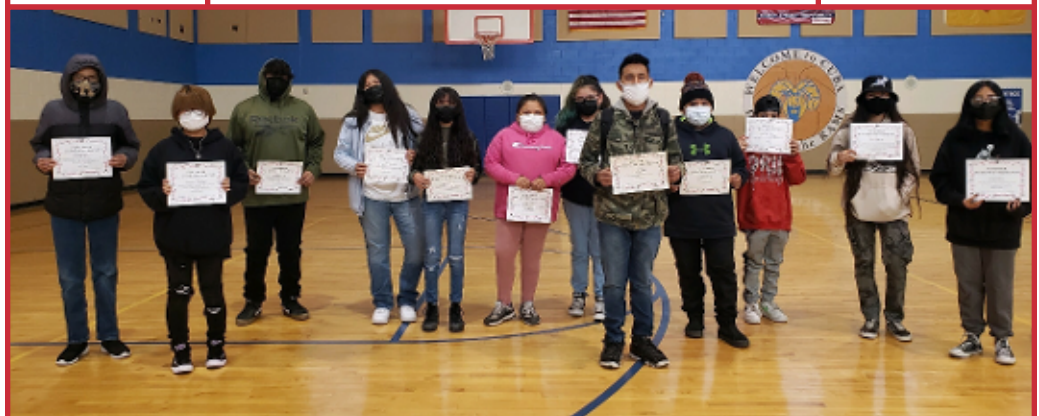

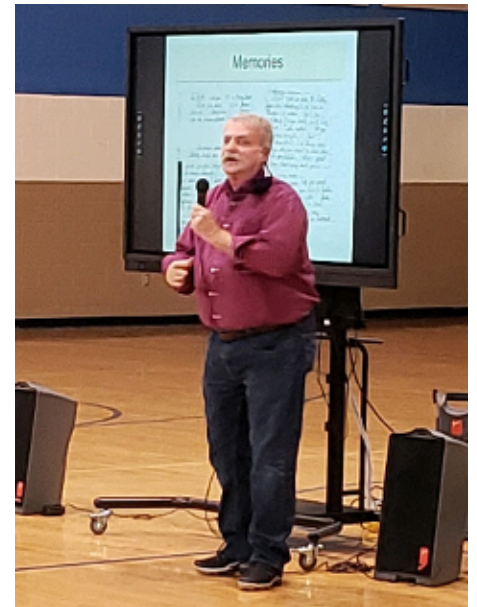
